at the fair. Boggio's stated that it was the best fair they had attended. Therapy dogs were
a great addition. The guest speaker was well received and the sit down lunch was a hit.

Notes for next fair:

- all vendors to be downstairs those upstairs did not get the same exposure
- map of vendors available at the door
- note on vendor application and acceptance letter that vendors can drop off materials at
 the door then park away from the main parking area. It is noted here that although a
 sandwich board was put out to designate the closest parking area as accessible as
 directed by Council, it did not work and accessible spaces fell far short.
- Seniors Lounge and 55+ membership We now have a bulletin board, whiteboard and signage. The tables are set with games, puzzles etc. and coffee/tea is available to members. Membership cards are now available for sale with 7 purchased to date and 2 free memberships were given away at the fair. An October schedule was put together and is available at the front desk. The November schedule is being worked on. The committee feels that the value added needs to be more specific which would make it more attractive to potential members. There is not sufficient advertising and it was suggested that we use the snap charts in the elevators and washrooms to promote the lounge as well as having flyers available in the 3 sided advertiser at the front entrance. It was moved by Ken and seconded by Dave that the November and December calendars be advertised in the voice carried. Julie to check with Marc regarding advertising \$\$ going forward.
- VIP Program The VIP program is now being overseen by the Culture and Community Enhancement Programmer. 2 members of staff attended a 2 day OTEC training session and are now Certified Trainers. A training session for those interested in this program has been set for Wednesday, October 30th from 9:30 – 3:30 with lunch provided. Sign up is through Eventbrite.
